278 MARILYN: [Well I] probably <@ could've bought it that way @>.
279 PETE: @@
280 MARILYN: But I- --
281 : .. you know,
282 : .. I said,
283 : I want it to be homemade.
284 : You know,
285 : something special.
286 PETE: .. Well at [least] they are uh like already breaded --
287 ROY: [Hm],
288 PETE: .. I mean crumbed and in the jar,
289 ROY: they're [working] on [2breed2]ing .. pre-breaded .. red snapper.
290 PETE: [XX]
291 MARILYN: [2Yeah2].

293 ROY: [30n3] fish farms.
294 MARILYN: ... @
295 ROY: ... Have you heard about these horrific ... uh new .. genetic ... developments,

315 : from [one end to another],

317 : who's doing [2this],
318 ROY: [2this is like,
319 MARILYN: UC Davis2].
320 ROY: (H) this2] is like some kind of horrific nightmare.

322 PETE: [3This3] --
323 ROY: this is [4tube chickens4].
324 PETE: [4That's horrible4].
325 MARILYN: .. [5<@ That is the worst @>5].
326 PETE: [5That's really true5]?

328 ROY: [6And it's just6] .. awful.
329 : Who wants [7to eat it7].
330 MARILYN: [7I think I'll dip7] these in <VOX e=gg VOX>.

332 PETE: [8Yeah8].

334 : .. the early man probably said ... the same thing about the first domestic chicken.
335 MARILYN: ... @

337 MARILYN: .. (H) .. <VOX Can you imagine,
338 : they're taking this beautiful jungle fowl,
339 : and they're leaving it in a box.
340 : That's gross VOX>.
341 ROY: .. <FOOD<@ Right @>FOOD>.
342 MARILYN: .. Oh,
343 : I wonder if it's this horrible --
344 ROY: ... Is there something fishy that smells?
345 MARILYN: ... No.
346 ROY: ... No,
347 : I- I think it's just residual,
348 : um,
349 MARILYN: Residual fish smell,
350 : from [the smelly fish].
351 ROY: [fish smell from the] ... (Hx) potent red snapper (Hx).
352 MARILYN: .. Well,
353 : .. it'll be unpotent in a minute.
354 : ... Not to worry.
355 : ... Let me see.
356 : ... What was I in here for,
357 : ... there's nothing worse than staring like a dope at your own refrigerator.
358 : ... Um,
359 : ... oh an egg.
360 : ... @God damn it,
361 : what'd you do.
362 : ... You <@ son of a bitch @>.

369 ROY: ... I'm laughing.
370 MARILYN: .. @ @@@
371 ROY: ... I got .. quite a giggle out of it.
372 MARILYN: @
373 ROY: ... Um,
374 MARILYN: ... [Um],
375 ROY: [did you] dispense with the uh ... tomatoes that I had sitting in here.
376 : ... In a [2fit of2] ... household efficiency.
377 MARILYN: [2these guys2]?
378 ROY: Those.
379 : Yes.
380 MARILYN: ... X,
381 : .. okay,
382 : egg.
383 : ... One egg will do=?
384 : ... So my mom didn't catch any fish.

385 ROY: ... Mhm.
386 MARILYN: .. Up north she said.
387 : ... Rotten luck.
388 PETE: Where were they fishing.
389 : .. Like in lakes,
390 : or,
391 MARILYN: .. [Um=,
392 PETE: [rivers,
393 MARILYN: I think,
394 PETE: or what].
395 MARILYN: um],
396 : at the mouth of rivers,
397 : .. on the coast of Or[egon].
398 PETE: [Oh].
399 ROY: .. Oh my.
400 : ... Oops.
401 : .. Too late.
402 MARILYN: ... They have some --
403 PETE: ... So like what are they catching,
404 : salmon and stuff?
405 MARILYN: [(THROAT)]
406 PETE: [Or what].
407 MARILYN: Yeah.
408 PETE: .. Unh[hunh].
409 MARILYN: [(H) And some] guy who- --
410 : .. who knows a good thing when he's on to it,
411 : .. (H) calls them up.
412 PETE: ... I [see].
413 MARILYN: [(H) (TSK)] And says,
414 : .. (TSK) <VOX oh=.
415 : .. The fish are running,
416 : don't you want to come up here,
417 : and blah blah [blah b- VOX> --
418 ROY: [And pay me zil][2lions2] of [3dollars3] [4to4],
419 MARILYN: You know].
420 PETE: [2Right2].
421 MARILYN: [3Pay me3],
422 PETE: [3Unhunh3].
423 MARILYN: [4pay me4],
424 : you know,
425 : eighty dollars a day to run my [boat].
426 PETE: [Right].
427 MARILYN: ... Catch fabulous salmon.
428 : ... [And they have it] canned.
429 PETE: [Unhunh].
430 MARILYN: .. You know,
431 : they eat it,
432 : ... when they're up there,
433 : .. and [I guess they] have some frozen,
434 PETE: [Right].
435 MARILYN: but they have it canned and,
436 PETE: Unhunh.
437 MARILYN: .. (TSK) <VOX put it in our stockings,
438 : for Christ[mas VOX>].
439 PETE: [Aw]=.
440 ROY: .. Isn't that great.
441 MARILYN: ... It's ... nice for them.
442 : They have some recreation with it.
443 PETE: ... But no salmon in your stockings this year.
444 : Hunh?
445 ROY: Spend [their va-] --
446 MARILYN: [Well,
447 : they] (Hx)= have already done it (Hx).
448 : .. [2So2].

449 PETE: [20h2].
450 MARILYN: ... I mean,
451 : .. this was,
452 : ... another [trip].
453 PETE: [This is the next trip].
454 MARILYN: In fact,
455 : they were supposed to] go up in um,
456 : ... more,
457 : .. you know,
458 : .. environmental thing.
459 : They were supposed to go up ... at the end of ... August.
460 : ... When .. they usually run,
461 : and,
462 : ...(TSK) (H) <VOX fish weren't running this year VOX>,
463 : you know,
464 : it's like everywhere.
465 : .. Nothing's doing what it's supposed to,
466 : .. anymore,
467 : .. [anywhere].
468 PETE: [Mhm]?
469 MARILYN: ... That's why that whole ... mountain climbing .. expedition was screwy.
470 PETE: What .. mountain climbing expedition was that.
471 : [XX] --
472 MARILYN: [The one that] we were .. [2part2] [3of3],
473 ROY: [2The .. ex2][3pedition we3] [4went on in4] [5Nepal5]?
474 PETE: [30h that3].
475 MARILYN: [4.. in Nepal4].
476 PETE: [5Unhunh5].
477 ROY: ... Um,
478 PETE: What was [the problem].
479 ROY: [was supposed to] be,
480 MARILYN: ... [2Supposed to be perfect weather=2],
481 ROY: [2right in between the --
482 : Yeah2],
483 : perfect weather,
484 : and all that stuff?
485 PETE: Unhunh.
486 ROY: .. And they ended up getting .. early .. winter .. storms.
487 : Or late monsoon storms.
488 : Or whatever.
489 MARILYN: ... Yeah,
490 : [whatever],
491 ROY: [And that's],
492 MARILYN: it was a=]typical weather.
493 PETE: .. [2Mhm2].
494 ROY: [2you know2].
495 : ... Everywhere .. we've been,
496 : ... in the past several years,
497 : .. everybody's talking about how,
498 : .. (H) the weather just .. isn't .. normal.
499 PETE: That's true.
500 : ... That's definitely been the case in Indonesia,
501 : for quite a few years.
502 MARILYN: Mhm.

522 : .. I- I don't know if our drought here will ever break.
523 : I wonder if this is just isn't,
524 MARILYN: .. This is it.
525 PETE: .. [Hm].
526 ROY: [the new] weather for southern California.
527 PETE: ... Well they --

529 : and that we're in the .. the middle of a normal cycle.

544 MARILYN: [twenty-eight-year-old],
545 : ... [2Harvard2] guy,
546 PETE: [2Right2],
547 MARILYN: who lives out in the woods,
548 : .. a [la Thor]eau,
549 PETE: [mhm].
550 MARILYN: (H) .. anyway,
551 : smart.
552 : ... And uh,
553 : ... (H) it's called,
554 : .. yeah.
555 : It's called The End of Nature,
556 : ... and it's just really a @scary @book.
557 : You know.
558 : (H) There's (H) no natural world left.
559 PETE: .. Right.
560 MARILYN: All the natural world was go=ne in nineteen seventy-five,
561 ROY: ... [His premise is basic]ally this.
562 MARILYN: [and now XXX],
563 ROY: ... That,
564 : .. um,
565 : ... as soo=n as the world hit a point,
566 : ... where ... there was no more ... objectively pristine .. land.
567 PETE: .. Unhunh.
568 ROY: .. When=,
569 : you know,
570 : ... they [found] pollution on top of Mount Everest,
571 PETE: [Right].
572 : mhm.
573 ROY: ... and at the very bottom of the ocean.
574 PETE: .. Right.
575 ROY: .. <FOOD Well,
576 : that's it FOOD>.

577 PETE: .. [Mhm].
578 ROY: [Man] has had .. some effect.
579 : ... On the entire absolute absoluteness of the globe.
580 PETE: .. Right.
581 ROY: .. So in principle,
582 : ... the concept of nature,
583 : as a system inside of which man lives,
584 : .. [is over].
585 PETE: [Mhm],
586 : .. Right.
587 ROY: .. And then,
588 : .. in practice,
589 : .. since then,
590 : which was fifteen years ago,
591 PETE: .. mhm,
592 ROY: ... <MRC man has had such MRC> dramatic impact,
593 : .. on ... what we used to think of as nature,
594 : .. (H) that,
595 : ... (Hx)
596 : ... that the only way to coexist with nature- --
597 : It's no longer,
598 : ... nature,
599 : .. the quasi religious,
600 : .. overarching,
601 : ordering principle,
602 PETE: Right.
603 ROY: in[side of which ..] mankind lives,
604 MARILYN: [Wordsworthian nature].
605 PETE: M[2hm2].
606 ROY: [2and2] uh-,
607 : you know,
608 : ... w- .. a a thing that we can all rely on as a balancing force,
609 : .. over and above ourselves,
610 : .. to order the universe.
611 : [Forget] all that.
612 PETE: [Mhm].
613 MARILYN: Woo that's spi[2cy.
614 ROY: [2It's now,
615 MARILYN: Shit.
616 : (THROAT)2]
617 ROY: .. you know2],
618 : the world is gonna be [3kept in order by the same3] people that brought you,
619 MARILYN: [3(COUGH) (COUGH)3]
620 : (COUGH)
621 ROY: [you know],
622 MARILYN: [(COUGH)]
623 ROY: the atomic [2bomb,
624 PETE: [2Right2].
625 MARILYN: [2[(H)=2]
626 ROY: and2],
627 MARILYN: (COUGH) [3(COUGH)3]
628 ROY: [3all3] @that @stuff.
629 : [4Right4]?
630 PETE: [4Right4].
631 ROY: .. [5Which just5] doesn't sound like a very practical ... proposal.
632 PETE: [5Yeah5].
633 MARILYN: ... Wow.
634 ROY: ... You know,
635 : the same people brought you the extinction of all the large mammals in .. [Europe] and America,
636 PETE: [X].
637 MARILYN: .. [2And the dodo2].
638 ROY: [2are now en2]trusted with,
639 PETE: ... [3main3]taining [4what's4] [5there5],
640 ROY: [3XX3]

641 MARILYN: [4The4] [5rest of the natural world5].
642 ROY: [5maintaining the en5]tire globe,
643 : .. for the [6rest of6] time.
644 PETE: [6mhm6].
645 : Right.
646 ROY: ... Not likely.
647 MARILYN: .. Mhm.
648 ROY: ... So,
649 : .. that was his .. basic premise.
650 : And then he goes on,
651 : for the rest of book,
652 : to [absolutely],
653 MARILYN: [Then <X it X> gets really] depressing @.
654 ROY: [2heartless2][3ly3],
655 PETE: [2@0h2] [3@good3].
656 MARILYN: [3@3] [4@@@4] [5@=
657 PETE: [4@ @oh @gee @4]
658 ROY: [5heartlessly debunk,

1376 : do you Q>?
1377 : And I said,
1378 : <Q well yeah,
1379 : in fact I do mind Q>.
1380 : Cause I thought the lemon tree was dying.
1381 : I didn't see any lemons on it.
1382 PETE: .. Unhunh.
1383 MARILYN: % % Cause she said,
1384 : (H) <Q you wouldn't mind if I came back and got a whole ba=g full,
1385 : would you Q>?
1386 PETE: R=ight.
1387 MARILYN: I said .. <Q yeah Q>.
1388 : [@@@ (H)
1389 PETE: [@@@@@]
1390 MARILYN: There's like one] lemon left on this [2tree that I2] can reach.
1391 PETE: [2Right2].
1392 MARILYN: You know?
1393 PETE: Unhunh.
1394 MARILYN: ... ~Roy's about to go to Africa,
1395 : and so I'd never- --
1396 : you know,
1397 : I'd have to get a ... step ladder out,
1398 : to pick my own lemons <X and stuff X>.
1399 : ... Give me a break.
1400 ROY: I have to use a um,
1401 : .. what,
1402 : this abrasive sponge,
1403 : to clean that table off.
1404 MARILYN: ... Okay.
1405 : ... Why,
1406 : is it grody?
1407 ROY: ... Well it just doesn't come off very easily.
1408 MARILYN: ... Should I make like tartar sauce,

1409 : or something really decadent?
1410 ROY: .. What's this in this squirt bottle?
1411 MARILYN: ... U=m,
1412 : .. Windex.
1413 ROY: ... I'm gonna use some of that.
1414 PETE: Does tartar sauce go with .. with Cajun spices.
1415 MARILYN: ... Well we could make --
1416 PETE: ... I mean,
1417 : that doesn't matter,
1418 : <X I suppose [it just X>] --
1419 MARILYN: [Oh],
1420 : you know what,
1421 : we have this neat .. [island] ... man[2go sauce2].
1422 ROY: [<X Fields X>] --
1423 PETE: [2Mm2].
1424 ROY: [2(SNEEZE)2]
1425 MARILYN: .. Chutney [3sauce3].
1426 ROY: [3Chut3]ney.
1427 MARILYN: That would be good.
1428 PETE: .. Yeah.
1429 MARILYN: ... I have tons of chutney.
1430 PETE: ... [Well that sounds good].
1431 MARILYN: [Chutney].
1432 PETE: ... Do you save these things?
1433 MARILYN: ... U=m,
1434 : I think that one'll save.
1435 : Yeah.
1436 PETE: Oh okay.
1437 : I'll just ... put it ... in [the sink].
1438 MARILYN: [<VOX Su=re VOX>].
1439 : ... What are those little things called.
1440 : Small plastic &
1441 PETE: ... Containers?
1442 MARILYN: & re-useable containers?
1443 PETE: [Right].
1444 MARILYN: [(Hx)]
1445 : ... I guess.
1446 : .. Mm.
1447 PETE: ... Oh,
1448 : this looks yummy.
1449 MARILYN: ... Oo=.
1450 : .. That's really good.
1451 : .. A little salty.
1452 : ... Mm[=].
1453 PETE: [Mm <X yeah X>].
1454 MARILYN: .. Oh,
1455 : .. I guess we ought to put those in the oven,
1456 : if we're gonna eat em.
1457 : Hm?
1458 PETE: ... It says chicken livers <X on it X>?
1459 MARILYN: ... @Yeah.
1460 : ... It's amazing what happens <@ if you keep it in [the fridge long enough @>.
1461 PETE: [<@ That's right @>].

1472 MARILYN: (H) But seriously folks.

1473 PETE: ... That looks good.
1474 MARILYN: ... Oh=,
1475 : ... shit.
1476 : ... <VOX Are we flaky yet VOX>?
1477 : .. No,
1478 : oo.
1479 : Not even close.
1480 PETE: ... <X Yum X>.
1481 : ... [XXXX do anything]?
1482 ROY: [My but it's hot].
1483 MARILYN: ... I know.
1484 : .. In here you mean?
1485 ROY: .. [Yes].
1486 MARILYN: [Well we got] everything on.
1487 : [2The ove=n2],
1488 ROY: [2You could say,
1489 : <Q my butt2] .. it's hot Q>.
1490 MARILYN: ... <VOX My butt VOX>.
1491 ROY: (COUGH) [(COUGH)]
1492 MARILYN: [@]
1493 : Where did that come from.
1494 : Why did we start saying that.
1495 : .. [<VOX My butt VOX>].
1496 ROY: [<MRC My but] she's fat MRC>.
1497 MARILYN: ... <VOX My butt,
1498 : .. she's fat VOX>.
1499 : .. Yeah,
1500 : .. where did we hear that.
1501 : .. On TV?
1502 ROY: It was a .. poster at a circus.
1503 MARILYN: ... Oh yeah=.
1504 : <VOX My butt,
1505 : ... [she's fat VOX>].
1506 PETE: [@ .. Fat].

1508 MARILYN: (H) Didn't we say --
1509 : .. weren't we saying that when we XX to see you in Indonesia?
1510 PETE: No,
1511 : I don't remember that.
1512 MARILYN: .. [<VOX My butt VOX>].
1513 PETE: [<X I think it's the X>] .. first time I've heard that.
1514 MARILYN: ... That's one of the things,
1515 : .. in my job I have to- --
1516 : Ouch.
1517 : Shit.
1518 : .. Watch out for.
1519 PETE: ... Saying things like that?
1520 MARILYN: .. Yeah.
1521 : Like,
1522 : ... um,
1523 : ... you know,
1524 : .. mo- mothers .. with --
1525 : ... you know,

1531 : All the [bad] breaks.
1532 PETE: [Oh].
1533 MARILYN: You have to watch for the bad breaks.
